As I reflect on the past year, I am proud to share the ways in which you have helped shape and grow our organization.

Since 2022, our organization went from supporting over 6,000 families a year to over 12,000!

This monumental change illustrates the power of our community: our hospital partners, community advocates and corporate donors including McDonald's. Together, we are meeting the needs of more sick children and families. None of this would be possible without our dedicated volunteers, staff, families, and supporters throughout the New York Metro and Long Island regions.

In 2024, we made tremendous progress on our goal to build another **Ronald McDonald House at Stony Brook Children's Hospital**. Set to open in 2027, our new, 60,000 sq. ft. building will provide families with private bedrooms and bathrooms, multimedia respite spaces, fresh meals, and support services while their children are in the

hospital. In April 2024, we broke ground on the future site of the new Ronald McDonald House with construction starting in 2025.

Behind the numbers are families — resilient families who care for their ill or injured children 24 hours a day. While we are steadfast in our commitment to expanding our reach, we are also committed to compassionate, transformative care.

We believe in a world where every family has what they need to ensure the best health outcomes for their children.

For 50 years, Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) has proudly been caring for families so they can care for theirs.

Dr. Audrey Evans pioneered the first

Ronald McDonald House in Philadelphia in 1974, and today there are over 390 Ronald McDonald Houses and over 270 Ronald McDonald Family Rooms worldwide.

as the 100th House in the RMHC system. Our organization continues to provide essential services that remove barriers, strengthen families, and promote healing when children need healthcare.



OUR PROGRAMS

Ronald McDonald House

Helping families physically, economically, and emotionally along their child's health-care journey.

The Ronald McDonald House program in New Hyde Park reduces stress and financial burden for families when they must travel to access medical care for their child.

Research shows that patients whose families stayed at the Ronald McDonald House are the sickest, traveled the farthest distances, and spent the longest time in the hospital.

Family proximity to the hospital provides important psychological benefits

- Parents get better sleep at a Ronald McDonald House
- Families who stay in a Ronald McDonald House report more positive hospital experiences and a greater ability to participate in their child's care



Ronald McDonald Family Rooms

A respite in the hospital, just moments from a child's bedside.

Located on Stony Brook Children's pediatric floor and Stony Brook Medicine's NICU, each **Ronald**



McDonald Family Room offers a place for families to rest and regroup away from the medical environment.

Families are welcomed by trained staff and volunteers with compassion and hospitality. Amenities include comfortable lounge seating, kitchen and snacks, donated meals, private bathroom and shower, laundry facilities, as well as TV and internet access.

Smiles, snacks, and coffee: Delivered



Always arriving at "just the right time," **Ronald McDonald Hospitality Carts** bring care and

comfort to the bedside. Volunteers offer sick children and their families a variety of snacks, beverages, toys, and personal care items several times a day. For parents and other caregivers who are reluctant to leave their critically ill or injured child even for just a moment, the bright and cheerful cart is a welcome sight.

Our beloved **Jack**, known to so many as **Jackie Boy**, was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) in early January at just three years old. The weight of this diagnosis has touched every member of our family deeply, shaking us to our core. Yet even in this difficult time, we've found strength in coming together, just as we always have.

The **Ronald McDonald House** has provided our family with the support we need to fight for Jack. Volunteers and staff at the House

have offered us a warm, supportive, home away from home while Jack is receiving medical care.

Our two older daughters (6) and our youngest (2) love coming to the Ronald McDonald House to play in the Play Room and grab a snack. Our family doesn't have to worry about a long commute or hotel costs — and we are walking distance from the hospital. The Ronald McDonald House has not only provided a comfortable bedroom and hot meals, but also emotional support when

we've needed it. The House has allowed us to put all our focus on being there for Jack, and the girls.

Jack isn't facing this battle alone. Because of the Ronald McDonald House, he has an incredible network of loved ones surrounding him with unwavering support, encouragement, and most importantly, love. Each of us is committed to being there for him every step of this journey, holding him in our hearts and standing ready to help in any way we can.

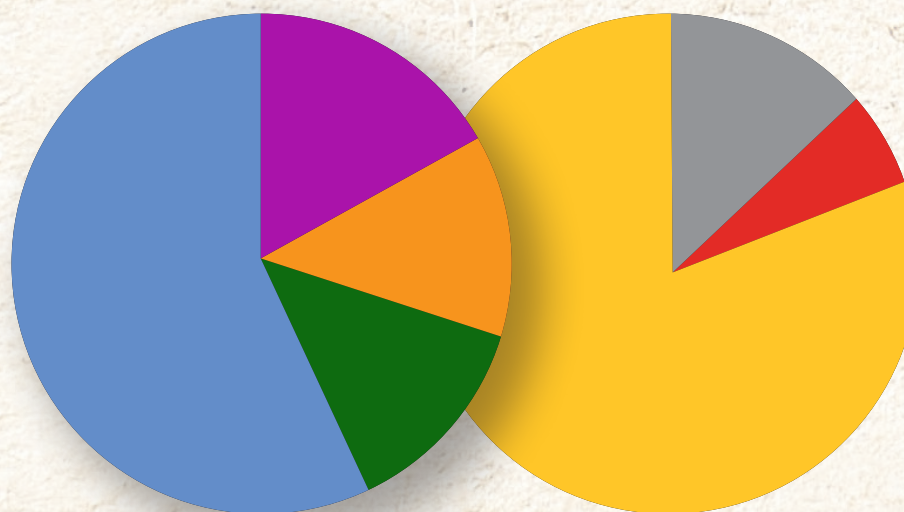

RONALD McDONALD HOUSE AT STONY BROOK

Celebrating the Groundbreaking for the First Ronald McDonald House in Suffolk!



On April 30, 2024, RMHC New York Metro held a groundbreaking ceremony for a new **Ronald McDonald House at Stony Brook Children's**. The ceremony was held at the future site of the 30-bedroom Ronald McDonald House, scheduled to open in 2027.

In partnership with Stony Brook University Hospital and Stony Brook Children's, we are slated to begin construction in 2025. The project will take approximately two years to complete with support from numerous organizations and individuals, all of whom helped us to raise funds and raise awareness for the project.

The Ceremonial Groundbreaking marked the beginning of the Capital Campaign's public phase and has since ushered in a new wave of support and enthusiasm from Stony Brook families and the broader Suffolk County community. The new Ronald McDonald House will provide sick children and families with a home away from home, adjacent to Suffolk County's first and only children's hospital.

We celebrate the accomplishments from our dedicated Board of Directors, the Building Committee, and the Capital Campaign

Cabinet who have helped in tremendous ways to ensure we continue to meet the needs of families in Suffolk County.
